Stage-Based Program Processes

Mental health court program logistics refers to the movement of the program participant through the territory of specific stage-based processes. Each process for each participant is without differentiation as to functional level or mental health condition.

The stage-based process of assimilation or organizational socialization involves the transition of the participant through the stages of anticipation, encounter, metamorphosis, and disengagement as they progress in levels of program participation.

 The Transtheoretical Model

The Transtheoretical model of behavior change is a stage-based self-change system that addresses the process of change in a non-lineal fashion focusing on five distinct stages including (1) precontemplation, (2) contemplation, (3) preparation, (4) action, and (5) maintenance, as well as specific tools and processes of change applicable to each distinct stage.

The process of adventure is taken from the work of Joseph Campbell on what is termed the "hero motif" in which participants undertake the quest for judicial reconciliation whereby they accept the call to adventure, pass through a series of trials, slay the mythic beast and obtain the coveted prize.
